The ski shows are a lot of fun, with all the major ski resorts and retailers showing their goods - it's also a great place to purchase new equipment. Seattle now has a giant ski show and sale with all of Seattle's best ski and snowboard shops-save up to 70% on ski and snowboard gear at both shows! So volunteer to work the booth and you can spend some time afterwards shopping!

RECAP OF SEPTEMBER NWSCC MEETING:

Jared Montague came from Brundage Mountain, Idaho, to update us on what is happening at Brundage. While not a destination resort, Brundage is located just minutes outside of McCall, Idaho, only a 9 hour drive from Portland. Brundage has been expanding, and offers 1,800 vertical feet of skiing with 5 lifts and 1,500 acres. The skiing includes both great groomers and gladed tree skiing. Snowcat skiing is offered on 19,000 permitted acres at a price starting at \$299/day plus tax, and the entire snowcat can be rented for a group. Further expansion is underway, including a new base lodge. A land swap with the Forest Service gives them the potential to expand an additional 1,200 vertical feet, with a total potential of 3,000 vertical feet over 3,000 acres! There is lots of lodging available in McCall, including a KOA Campground which is open all year. Brundage's lodging partner is the Shore Lodge in McCall, which will offer package rates. Check their website at www.brundage.com for details on skiing, group rates, and specials.

NWSCC is offering an early season "Ski Safari" to Salt Lake City December 11-14, 2009, which is open to all club members. \$585 PP/DO will get you 4 days of skiing at Alta, Snowbird, Solitude and Brighton; 3 nights' lodging at Crystal Inn; breakfasts and light dinners at the hotel; and private ground transportation from and to the airport, and to the ski areas. Participants will arrange their own transportation to Salt Lake City, and should plan on an early morning flight in order to be able to ski the day you arrive. The FWRA Championships will be held at Mammoth Mountain, California, April 9-11, 2010. NWSCC is planning a trip to Mammoth, and has booked condos for a 5-day trip. Horizon Air is offering a roundtrip flight from Portland to Mammoth for \$185, cutting out the 3 hour bus ride from Reno! Exact details are TBA. Everyone will be welcome, racer or not, to join us and ski this incredible mountain - it's not named "Mammoth" for nothing!

The 2010 "Bachelor Blast" trip has been set for April 15-18 at Sunriver. We will have great lodging and lift ticket prices for a very affordable weekend (either 2 nights or 3 nights), which will include some on-mountain events, and might even offer a ski and golf combination.

The Mt. Hood Ski Patrol's main fundraiser this year is a continuation of a joint venture with the West Linn High School ski team: a Ski Swap and Sale to be held October 9-10, 2009, at West Linn High School. Admission is \$3 for an individual and \$6 for a family, but you can get \$1 off by registering online in advance at www.mhsss.com for a drawing for a 2009-2010 season pass for Timberline, Meadows, or Skibowl! The hours of the sale are 5 pm-9 pm on Friday and 9 am to 9 pm on Saturday. Consignment items may be left on Friday from noon to 9 pm, or on Saturday from 8 am to 10 am. You can pick up unsold items and get your check on Sunday. The consignment fee is 15% of the sale price. This isn't just a swap with used items - there are over 5,000 pieces of **NEW equipment** as well, from local ski shops Hillcrest, the Mountain Shop, Next Adventure, the Ski Chalet, and the Rack Attack. You can also get early season pass prices from the local ski areas - and this is one opportunity you have to save \$50 and put together a group for a Mt. FWSA Cruise in the fall of 2010 - Leaving Boston, visiting Portland, Maine; Bar Harbor, St. John, New Brunswick, Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Boston. The Cruise Company is putting together a package for this cruise. There will also be a package prior to the cruise to tour the Boston area. Pricing will be available for this trip at a later date.

How about a really memorable way to celebrate the new year in 2011? FWSA is joining Holidaze Ski Tours for an Antarctica Adventure & New Year's Eve in Buenos Aires December 29, 2010-January 12, 2011!!! Participants will leave December 29, 2010, for a 15 day trip with 3 nights in Buenos Aires, followed by a flight to Ushuaia and a 10-day cruise on the MS Fram. The cruise includes meals, lectures, guided tours and many fantastic locations and sights you have only seen on TV, including whales, seals, penguins, icebergs, snowy peaks, ice cliffs, and much more! The last night will be at a hotel in Ushuaia. Prices including airfare from JFK or LAX start at approximately \$5,800 pp/do including extra charges, and go up from there - but this is probably a once in a lifetime opportunity!

The Far West Ski Association founded its Athletic Scholarship program in 2004 to provide financial assistance to deserving young ski racers. Applicants must be junior alpine ski racers licensed by the United States Ski Association (USSA) and participate in racing programs in the states represented by the councils of the FWSA. Scholarships are awarded based on financial need, academic performance, athletic achievement and community activities. Additional information is available at the FWSA website (www.fwsa.org). Northwest Snowsports Foundation, which evolved from NWSCC and has given scholarships to many deserving young Northwest racers over the years, has announced its dissolution, and recommends that donations for scholarships be given to the FWSA Scholarship program, where they can still be earmarked for Northwest recipients.

NEW BENEFIT: Mt. Bachelor will offer a FREE picture "Club Card" to NWSCC club members. Here's the latest:

- 1. For the general public: Up until the lifts open for the year Mt. Bachelor is offering a "club card" picture pass for \$29 that will allow purchase of \$49 non-holiday lift tickets online (excluded dates are 12/26/09-1/3/10; 1/16-18/10; 2/13-15/10).
- 2. NWSCC club members can go to the Sports Desk at Bachelor up through January 31 and get that same card for FREE by showing your NWSCC membership card and picture ID. (The card cannot be obtained for free at ski shows or other places Mt. Bachelor sells them.)
- 3. On the day you pick up the Club Card, you can "load" it with your credit card with multiples of \$49. In the future you can load it up any time online before arriving at the mountain. When you get to the mountain, you can go directly to the lifts and, as you pass through, \$49 will be deducted from your balance on the Club Card. Note that you can load the card in person at the Sports Desk only the first time. After that, you'll need to do it online, using a credit card.

The SKIA Dance video is a must-see. How can people dance with skis on their feet and no snow? You have to see it! I'm sorry that I ran out of camera card space for Phil Mahre's video. He tells us his personal story, but also addresses the larger question of gold medals in general and our life goal, and what is truly important in life. Phil begins with emotion after a very inspiring speech by Kevin Hansen, a ski competitor who broke his neck at Timberline (in 1975) and told us how he coped and managed to overcome this and find new meaning and new goals in his life. He is currently the Director for World Wheelchair Sports. Sadly, I did not record that speech. Like I said, I wasn't prepared for how wonderful and inspiring the whole evening would be. At the end of the evening, the new NWSCC logo was unveiled. Inspired by volcanos! (Did you notice it at the top of this newsletter?)

NWSCC'S NEW "VOLCANO" LOGO: Looking to retire our current logo, we searched and debated ... what image uniquely represents the northwest and speaks to who we ALL are? The Cascade Volcano!

In selecting this image, NWSCC selected colors blue and white surrounded by green. Blue and white represent sky and snow. Green mimics our northwest mountain forests. Smoke rising from the volcano distinguishes our logo from other ski club and council logos. Smoke also suggests volcanic energy, a metaphor for our mountain passion. Multiple plumes of smoke visually represent our many clubs-all rising from the crater. While NW SCC Clubs flow in different directions, our collective soul resides in the heart of the volcano.

Our new logo was designed by Victor Echevarria of Twirl Advertising & Design under the direction of Council Vice President, Richard Rizk, with input from the entire NWSCC Board.
