BIG changes are coming to the PACRAT racing program this year! The PACRAT league has made the decision to buy its own race timing equipment - a state of the art wireless Phoenix timing system. This will be the finest timing system found on the mountain, and PACRAT will be trained by the manufacturers on how to properly set it up and operate our own equipment to help reduce the timing malfunctions that can be associated with ski racing. PACRAT is going to great lengths to see to it that our racers will have an enjoyable on the hill experience. One variable we can't always control is Mother Nature!

FWSA NEWS AND TRIPS:

FWSA is on Facebook!

Next year's **FWSA Convention** will be held in Industry Hills, California (Los Angeles area) June 9-12, 2011. The Pacific Palms Golf Course (where the tournament will be held) is rated number one in the nation. It is apparently closer to the Ontario airport than the Los Angeles airport.

The National Ski Council Federation and Aspen Skiing Company are sponsoring the **Snowmass Alpine Nationals** ski race January 3-9, 2011 at Snowmass. The midweek event is a race between council racers and all ski club and councils are invited to participate. Cost is \$190 per person plus lodging, lift tickets, and transportation. The **2012 Ski Week** will be in **Jackson Hole, Wyoming**, January 28-February 4, 2012! A \$100 deposit made out to NWSCC will hold your spot, and is fully refundable until July of 2011.

FWSA offers one USA ski week, one European ski week (usually with pre and post-trip extensions), and a number of "adventure" trips. They have had cruises and a trip to Thailand, and are looking at possible future trips including a trip to Australia and/or New Zealand in August of 2011. NWSCC can still get you on the 2011 FWSA Ski Week in Sun Valley (January 22-29, 2011), though possibly not with our group (we had to turn back spots that were in demand by other Councils). Depending on lodging, the trip price ranges from \$895 to \$1325 per person, without transportation. If you have access to your own lodging at Sun Valley you may purchase an "amenities package" that includes registration, racing, parties, picnic, banquet, and the 5 days of lift tickets included. A \$100 deposit is still necessary to hold that reservation.

See the attached Sun Valley flier to determine what type of

lodging you would like to request. There's lots of flexibility with this trip. If you don't want to use all your lift tickets, their value may be applied to other activities, including lessons, dining and entertainment, ice skating and lunch, massage, gifts, or even helicopter skiing!

Children are welcome on this trip, but there is no special child's pricing. Senior discount pricing will be answered soon. This is a great trip from the Northwest, as Sun Valley is within driving distance for most of us, saving the cost and hassles of air travel. However, if you wish to fly, FWSA will arrange air and shuttles. Contact Barbara Bousum with questions at travel@nwskiers.org.

Interested in a chance to WIN a spot on the FWSA Sun Valley trip valued at \$950+? NWSCC will be selling tickets, with the drawing to be held at a time to be announced. The cost is \$20 for one ticket or \$50 for three tickets. The winner will receive one fully paid trip with condominum lodging (transportation not included; an upgrade to hotel lodging would be at the winner's cost). If you have already paid a deposit at that time, your deposit will be refunded. Tickets are available through Sheri Parshall or other NWSCC officers. Only 250 tickets will be sold, so your chances are far better than the lottery!

FWSA will offer a trip to **Switzerland** (Engelberg and Interlaken) **February 26-March 7, 2011**, starting around \$1,357 without air. A Bulgaria extension March 7-13 starts around \$954, and a further extension to Bucharest and Transylvania March 13-19 is \$1,140. See fliers. THERE IS STILL ROOM ON THIS TRIP!

FROM FWSA News:

• The FWSA scholarships for 2010-2011 are in the final stage of the approval process. Fifteen scholarships have been approved with the possibility of a 16th. Despite a poor showing at the 2010 convention (raffle/auction receipts were \$1000 below 2009), the addition of two, possibly three, scholarships can be attributed to the generous donation from the Far West Racing Association and the addition of three (possibly four) new partners: Mountain High Snowsports Club (Portland, OR), Los Angeles Council, and

San Diego Council. In addition, Skiyente, our first partner, has raised \$1,050 for its Erin Nicole Award which will be awarded separately.

- Heli-Skiing Operation to Open in Lake Tahoe Long absent from the Sierra Nevadas, heli-skiing returns to Lake Tahoe after a nearly forty-year absence. We spoke to the owner of the newly opened Pacific Crest Heli-Guides about filling the void. The heli-deprived residents of Lake Tahoe can finally rejoice... and start saving. Pacific Crest Heli-Guides in partnership with HeliTahoe have announced plans to operate a full-fledged heli-skiing operation accessing over 100,000 skiable acres along the spine of the Pacific Crest beginning December 15. Outside of a few unsuccessful heli-skiing enterprises in the early 1970's, much of Tahoe's potential heli-accessed terrain has remained untouched for almost four decades.

The American Birkebeiner Ski Foundation (ABSF) announced that it is currently seeking grant applications for young skier programs associated with schools and cross-country ski organizations throughout the country. "The mission of the Foundation is to promote cross-country skiing as a fun, energetic activity that is part of an active and healthy lifestyle," said Executive Director Ned Zuelsdorff. "A significant portion of our effort focuses on young skiers. To this end the Foundation annually provides grant funding to young skier programs. Zuelsdorff said the ABSF will award a total of \$15,000 in grants with up to \$1,000 being awarded to each organization selected. He said grant applications from youth cross-country ski programs throughout the country are welcomed. Priorities for ABSF funding include, but are not limited to the creation or expansion of young skier programs and first time applicants. Zuelsdorff said the Young Skier Development Grant application is available here. Grant applications are due in the American Birkebeiner office by Friday, October 1, 2010. The ABSF Skier Development Committee will review all applications received by the deadline and

announce grant awards by November 1, 2010. If you are interested in helping this effort and contributing to the Young Skier Development Fund, which is used exclusively for this purpose, call (715) 634-5025 or send a check to "ABSF," PO Box 911, Hayward WI 54843, designating Young Skier Development Fund.
