FWSA SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO NORTHWEST JUNIOR RACERS!! By Dick Shawkey, FWSA Scholarship Committee

Five Pacific Northwest Division athletes have been honored for their alpine ski racing performance and potential. The Far West Ski Association (FWSA) has awarded grants of \$500 to \$1,000 to be used to cover training and competition fees during the 2010-2011 ski racing season. These athletes' hard work and dedication extends to their academics as well, where they share an average GPA of over 3.95.

Linnea Baysinger (\$500), age 15, trains with the Team Alpental Snoqualmie Ski Team. Linnea finished the 2009-2010 season nationally ranked as 1st in Super G and 4th in Giant Slalom. In addition, she achieved a top 25

ranking in Slalom. Last season, she reached the podium at 10 events, including five 1st place finishes.

Haley Hanseler (\$750), age 16, of Longview, WA., is a member of the Mt. Hood Ski Team. Haley's hard work and dedication paid solid dividends during the 2009-2010 season, with her achieving national ranking in the top 25 for four alpine disciplines: 3rd in Downhill, 2nd in Super G, 17th in Giant Slalom, and 22nd in Slalom. Her season culminated with a trip to the J-2 Nationals in Sugarloaf, Maine, and a top ten finish in Super G at the Western Regionals at Mission Ridge, WA. In 2010, Heley finished eight out of ten Super G races in the top ten. She is currently training to compete in the NORAMs in Lake Louise, Alberta (6-10 December). Haley is sponsored by the Mountain High Snowsports Club of Portland, OR, a FWSA Athletic Scholarship partner.

Nahanni Lukes (\$500), age 14, is a member of the Mt. Ashland Ski Team. During the 2009-2010 season, Nahanni distinguished herself by finishing first in her year group in Slalom for the Pacific Northwest Division and eleventh nationally. In addition, she had two strong finishes in Super G at the Mt. Hood J-3 Qualifiers in February 2010.

Jordan Schweitzer (\$1,000), age 16, is a member of the Mt. Bachelor Ski Team. She finished the 2009-2010 season nationally ranked as 1st in Downhill, 9th in Super G, and 16th in Giant Slalom. Winning the J-2 women's Downhill championship at Sugarloaf, ME, last March capped a very successful ski season. She is currently training to compete in the NORAMs at Lake Louise, Alberta, (6-10 December). Jordan is also the 2010 recipient of the Skiyente Ski Club's Erin Nicole Award (\$1,050) for outstanding athletic achievement.

Cai Yamamoto (\$1000), age 16, trains with the Mission Ridge Ski Team. During the 2009-2010 season, Cai distinguished himself by earning national ranking as 2nd in Super G and top 25 in all four alpine disciplines.

- Far West Racing Championships April 1-3, 2011 at Alpine Meadows; Special Lift Ticket and Lodging Pricing; Individual and Team Awards; Special Junior Racer Price Silent Auction and Banquet; Child Dinner \$15 (age 0--12).
- Chamonix-Mont-Blanc, France has been chosen as the site of the 2012 Annual International Ski Week. Put this ski week on your 2012 planning calendar.
- The California Ski Cancer Prevention Program has awarded a grant to FWSA to develop a program to inform young snowsports enthusiasts and their parents on the dangers of skin cancer. The Slip, Slop, Slide, and Slither program featuring informative brochures, decals, and a sunscreen partner is being developed and administered by Fran Long, Trustee and Youth & Family Involvement Chair. The program will be presented at the major ski shows in LA, San Jose, San Diego and San Francisco this fall, distributing informational brochures, decals, and sunscreen samples. In addition, FWSA will distribute the materials at Mammoth Mountain and Lake Tahoe area during school holiday periods in order to reach more children and their families.
- · March 17, 2011 is the deadline for all history-related submittals – Western Ski Heritage prize, Club/council History Recognition, Roll of Remembrance, nominations
- · Far West Ski Foundation will soon launch new websites: http://FWSF.net_and_http://FarWestSkiFoundation.org
- Vail Resorts acquires Northstar Stock purchase costs \$63 million. The acquisition includes all mountain operations of Northstar, all commercial space in the base village, and Northstar Property Management. Management

and ownership of the Ritz-Carlton Lake Tahoe, which opened in 2009, will remain unchanged.

- · Whistler/Blackcomb to Go Public Want to own a share of the biggest ski area in North America? Now you can. Starting as early as next month Whistler Blackcomb will be a publicly traded company on the Vancouver Stock Exchange, which means that you could own a share. In the initial public offering, the newly formed Whistler Blackcomb Holdings Inc. is predicted to raise \$300 million, part of which will go towards paying off Intrawest. Shares are said to start at between \$14 and \$15. According to a Reuters report, once the company goes public it will be jointly owned by public shareholders and Intrawest. Ten Canadian investment banks are backing the sale. Earlier this summer, there were reports of Intrawest shopping Whistler to a Russian investor. The Vancouver Sun reported that Whistler has been in debt since Fortress, Intrawest's parent company, acquired it in 2006. "Visitor aversion" during the Olympics cost the resort a reported \$6.2 million Canadian, but they expect skier visits to come back, and even increase after the international exposure the games created.
- Eagle Point: Utah's Newest Resort Dormant for eight years, now the former sleepy Elk Meadows Ski Resort in southern Utah is prepping to get back in the game, as Eagle Point. As Utah's 14th ski resort, the ski hill has a new name, a new plan, new ownership and, most importantly, still gets plenty of snow. Tucked into the Tushar Mountains, the third highest range in Utah, the resort is slated to open on December 15th, weather permitting. With a base at 9,100', it offers 1,300' of vertical, 400" of annual snowfall, and six fixed-grip chairlifts.
- Daron Rahlves, Shane McConkey Elected to U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame Ishpeming, Mich.—World Champion ski racer Daron Rahlves of Truckee, the late Shane McConkey of Squaw Valley, and iconic Heavenly skiing legend Glen Plake are among a roster of six skiers and builders named as inductees to the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame's Class of 2010. They will be joined by Paralympic medalist and World Champion, Muffy Davis (Salt Lake City), Bobby Cochran (Surry, N.H.), and noted sports builder and Sun Valley owner Earl Holding (Salt Lake City). The class will be inducted on April 2, 2011 at Sun Valley, Idaho.
- Advice for the 50-Something Shredders Not every skier is a pre-teen jibster with joints like Gumby. If you're more towards middle age than 20-something, check out some tips to help you stay strong on the slopes from Dr. Tom Vangsness, skier and Chief of Sports Medicine at the Keck School of Medicine at University of Southern California. What can older skiers do to make sure that they

don't injure themselves skiing? First, skiing is a sport that demands physical fitness and joint flexibility. If you're sedentary and don't exercise, then don't expect to simply walk out of your office and onto the slopes, at least not without dramatically increasing your risk to injury. To ski safely—and I would add enjoyably—the body must be in shape.

· Pre-season Training for six weeks with Ted Ligety, Olympic gold medalist and two-time World Cup giant slalom champ. In the third in Ted Ligety's pre-season training series, Ted and his trainer, Alex More, show us how to do split squats, which work the quads, glutes and hamstrings. Moore says this exercise builds strength across the hips and thighs and, because it is unilateral, it exposes weakness if you have any. To make them easier, do them without any weight. To increase the difficulty, elevate your rear leg. Having the rear foot elevated also increases the stretch in the anterior (front) pelvis thus aiding mobility.
