Word came from Ron Ewert of Skihawks Ski Club on March 7 that there is presently a skier missing at Crystal Mountain, Washington - Paul Melby, a very experienced skier who could handle anything on the mountain, but disappeared under conditions where it appears probable that he fell into a tree well. Everyone who skis off the packed runs should be fully aware of the dangers of tree wells, and should try to stay well away from the bases of trees, especially when there are branches that extend into the snow around the tree. Lastly, just this week (March 10) there was a devastating accident on Highway 26 near Government Camp where an out-of-control driver who had been reported traveling at speeds in excess of 100 miles per hour spun out of control and into the path of a vehicle being driven by Willy Scroggins, who is well known in our area as a long time racer and racing coach (and heavily involved in the local World Cup Dreams events to benefit the US Ski Team athletes). The vehicle split in half and both vehicles burst into flames. The driver who caused the accident was pronounced dead at the scene, and Willy was taken by Life Flight to Legacy Emanuel Hospital in Portland, where he

was treated for a shattered femur, broken ribs, concussion, and multiple bruises. We wish Willy the best for his recovery.

TREE WELL SKIER SAFETY INFORMATION AVAILABLE! There has been a lot of press on tree well deaths in or near ski resorts this season. Such accidents are mostly preventable and this might be an excellent subject for ski club meetings or newsletters. There is now an excellent website devoted to avoided such accidents and all the information is available free to the skiing public. See http://www.treewelldeepsnowsafety.com.

(Interesting idea!) MOUNTAIN HIGH HELMETS-ONLY LIFT LINE IS FASTER. California's Mountain High Resort now has a helmet-only lift line midweek to promote the wearing of the helmets. The helmet line goes much faster then the regular lift line.

U.S. SKI RESORT COUNT: FROM 735 TO 471 IN 30 YEARS. The National Ski Areas Association reports that in the winter of 1982-1983, there were 735 ski resorts operating in the United States, but that by 2010 that number had dropped to 471 resorts. And we can now deduct from the list Maine's Big Squaw, New Hampshire's Tenney Mountain, and Vermont's Ascutney -- all of which have closed permanently before or during this ski season.

FROM FWSA NEWS:

· Athletic Scholarship Recipients: The 2010-2011 junior racing began early with a late summer international race in New Zealand. Two FWSA Athletic Scholarship recipients finished among the top competitors with Nicolo Monforte, Squaw Valley, and Dylan Murtha, Sugar Bowl, finishing overall 10th and 13th respectively. Both broke into the top ten in at least one GS race. In December, Morganna Murphy, Squaw Valley, reached the podium in FIS races in Alyeska, AK, with a 3rd in SL, while Diamond Peak's Lila Lipanja won two first places in SL at Mammoth. Lila went on to take a 3rd place in SL and in GS at races in Snowbird, UT, and Park City, UT, while Morganna racked up two 2nd places in SL at Sugar Bowl, CA. In January, Jordan Schweitzer competed at the NORAMs in Lake Louise, Alberta. Jordan finished 25th and 23rd in Downhill; respectable finishes for the 16 year old from Mt. Bachelor given that she was racing against C and D level members of several national ski teams.

- · March 15 is the deadline to apply for the 2011 FWSA Charity and Community Service Recognition Program. The committee will take into consideration the size of the club, the number of charitable activities, and also for each separate activity the preparation time, the number of club participants, and the goal/result/benefit.
- March 17, 2011 is the deadline for all history-related submittals – Western Ski Heritage prize, Club/council History Recognition, Roll of Remembrance, nominations.
- · Coalition of Environmental Groups Call for U.S. Forest Service to Regulate Snowmobile Use. The coalition petitioned U.S. Department of Agriculture Under Secretary Harris Sherman and U.S. Forest Service Chief Tom Tidwell, asking that they close a "loophole" in a 2005 travel management rule that exempts over-snow vehicles from rules affecting off-highway vehicles operating in national forests. The regulations designate roads and trails in forests where motorized vehicles are allowed and where they are prohibited. Snowmobile groups were quick to attack the proposal, stating that snowmobiles are by nature far different from all-terrain vehicles, dirt bikes and other motorized vehicles. (Winterwildlands.org & other sources) NOTE: The NSCF was asked to join the petition by the Winter Wildlands Alliance. The executive board decided to refrain from joining a petition that pitted one outdoor snow sport against another.

Lindsey Vonn has been named U.S. Olympic Committee's Sportswoman of the Year for 2010 - the second consecutive year Vonn has earned this honor. In 2010 Lindsey became the first American woman to win an Olympic gold medal in downhill. She also won an Olympic bronze medal in Super G. Vonn set an American record with 11 wins on the FIS World Cup in 2010 which led to a 3rd overall title, 3rd downhill title, 2nd super G title, and a super combined title. The last female alpine skier to achieve this USOC Sportswoman of the Year honor was Vonn's childhood hero Picabo Street in 1998. Vonn is the first woman since track and field legend Jackie Joyner Kersee (1986-87) to win the award back-to-back.

Airbags for Skiers? Skiers and snowboarders can already benefit from airbags, albeit a different type of airbag than you'd see in a car. Avalanche airbags from companies like Snow Pulse and Backcountry Access are designed to inflate in the event of an avalanche, helping the victim to stay afloat on the snow and protecting his head and neck from blunt force trauma. If Italian company Dainese has anything to say about it, skiers will also have access to a more traditional type of airbag designed to protect them in the event of a crash. The company's D-Air wearable airbag was originally designed for motorcycle racing and will soon launch in a street and racing version.

- U.S. Ski & Snowboard Hall of Fame Class of 2010 inductees named in November 2010 with induction ceremony to be held in April 2011 at Sun Valley, ID, include: Daron Rahlves (world champion ski racer with 9 downhill victories, the most decorated U.S. downhiller), Glen Plake (skiing legend with 3 World Hot Dog Ski Championships), the late Shane McConkey (big mountain free skier, inventor of Spatula and Pontoon skis), Muffy Davis (paralympic medalist and world champion), Bobby Cochran (Olympian from Vermont, 1st male U.S. skier to win a World Cup GS), and Earl Holding (resort builder "C Sun Valley, ID & Snowbasin, UT).
