#### PACRAT INFORMATION:

The Rat Attack was held April 15, 2011, at The Refectory, and the winning teams for the year were announced. Here's the report from Dale Parshall: Thanks to everyone's help slipping, we had a great last race at Ski Bowl. It had



been a while since we last ran on Dog Leg and it was a fun course. Ruttin' Rats (Schnee Vogeli) made it interesting by scoring only 24 points, of which 18 went to the bottom line due to the 4 out of 5 scoring system. Avalanche Express (Mountain High) scored 41 counting points, but came up 4 points short, giving the title to Ruttin' Rats! Racy Brats (Skiyente) and Rattitudes (Mountain High) were only another 2 points back in a tie for 3<sup>rd</sup>, and Kiss My Wax (Skiyente) rounded out the top five.

King and Queen Rat are awards to racers who show the most consistent and greatest improvement over the course of the season. This year's King Rat is John Barton (Schussing Shysters, Mountain High) who improved his handicap in three races and showed an overall improvement of 41%. Queen Rat is Natalie Shaffer (Slic Chics, Skiyente) who showed improvement in every race and had an overall 40% improvement over the year.

Full details are on the PACRAT website, including Dale's annual statistics. The correlation between participation and final team standings is very clear. Dale says the year went pretty well and better than recent seasons, even with the weather issues. The new timing system worked well and we should improve as we learn its nuances.

"Local" Mt. Hood news: Mt. Hood Meadows has announced plans for construction of its first new lift since 2005. In early May, work will begin on removing Stadium, one of Meadows' original lifts, and replacing it with a new generation Poma high speed detachable quad. This important project will not only improve the overall skiing and riding experience for guests, but also allow for important wetland restoration in the base area. The new, modern lift will represent a significant upgrade over Stadium. Maximum uphill capacity will reach 2,000 people per hour, versus the current maximum of 1,200 which the lift rarely achieves. With a more robust design, the new lift will be more stable in high winds and will therefore run at maximum capacity more often. The bottom terminal will be much closer to the lodge - guests will find the load point approximately 300 feet closer than it is currently located. The top terminal will be placed on the ridge near the top of Heather lift, which will significantly improve access to the north side areas, including Heather Canyon, Shooting Star, and Hood River Meadows. According to Mt. Hood Meadows CEO Matthew Drake, "A significant element of this project is the restoration of the wetland complex at the base of Blue chair over to the bottom of Mt. Hood Express and continuing to the base of Stadium. This project will restore approximately 1.5 acres of wetland within our area. It will also include innovative design engineering for the re-construction of existing roads to 'float' above the wetland areas without impacting their hydrological function or the propagation of wetland vegetation."

**LEARN TO SKI/SNOWBOARD MONTH GAVE 75,000 LESSONS** - According to the organizers of Learn to Ski and Snowboard Month (LSSM), 2011 ski areas nationwide provided more than 75,000 lessons to children and adults this January.

Northstar-at-Tahoe will install a new high-speed quad chairlift on the backside of the mountain -- accessing additional glade skiing and two more trails, which will increase their skiable terrain by 10 percent.

## CALIFORNIA'S FIRST INDOOR SKI RESORT?

Recognizing the value of burgeoning California snow skiing market, , Pensus Lake Berryessa Properties is proposing to construct the first indoor ski hill in California at its Manzanita

Canyon Resort. Pensus Ski Berryessa will operate year round and plans to add a special feature for snow boarders during the summer months. From Labor Day through Memorial Day they plan a specially-designed half-pipe which will send snowboarders sailing out over Lake Berryessa, which is in Napa County, California.

As with the many other such indoor ski facilities in Texas, North Carolina, New Jersey, and Nevada that have been announced in the past few years, we'll wait and see what actually happens.

## **VAIL'S EPIC PASS PRICES ANNOUNCED**

Vail Resort's season passes are now good at several of their resorts and can be used by destination skiers who ski more than once a year as well as for local skiers - and some of Vail's passes are now valid in both Colorado and Lake Tahoe. Here's what's available.

- (1) The Epic Pass offers unrestricted skiing at Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge, Keystone, Heavenly, Northstar, and Arapahoe Basin for \$649.
- (2) The Epic Local Pass for Colorado is \$499 for unrestricted skiing at Breckenridge, Keystone and A Basin -- plus 10 restricted days at Vail or Beaver Creek and restricted days at Heavenly and Northstar-at-Tahoe.
- (3) Summit Value Pass is \$409 for unlimited and unrestricted lift access to Keystone and Arapahoe Basin -- and Breckenridge with restrictions.
- (4) The Tahoe Value Pass is \$379 and gives access to Heavenly and Northstar-at-Tahoe, except Saturdays at Northstar-at-Tahoe). In all cases, a \$49 payment by May 30 is required, with the balance due in September.

- · U.S. Ski Resort Count: from 735 TO 471 in 30 Years The National Ski Areas Association reports that in the winter of 1982-1983, there were 735 ski resorts operating in the United States but that by 2010 that number had dropped to 471 resorts. And we can deduct from the list, Maine's Big Squaw, New Hampshire's Tenney Mountain, and Vermont's Ascutney -- all of which have closed permanently before or during this ski season.
- · Vail Resorts has announced a \$30 million investment plan for Northstar-at-Tahoe ski resort that will include new restaurants, national retail outlets and 10 percent more skiable terrain for the 2011-12 winter season. On-mountain improvements: With a vertical rise of 1,440 feet, a detachable express quad chairlift will be installed this summer on "The Backside" of the mountain, providing access to expanded terrain and new ski trails. Two new intermediate trails will be served by the lift, Vail said, and new snowmaking will be installed on Drifter — an existing ski trail that also provides access to The Backside — and one of the new trails. An on-mountain restaurant will be constructed near the top of the Tahoe Zephyr Express lift, according to Vail, offering 500 indoor seats and 200 outdoor deck seats. Menu items will include pizza and specialty soups and sandwiches. Village enhancements: Northstar village will also receive a facelift, Vail said, as plans for next winter include opening national retail outlets Patagonia and Burton, as well as expanding the North Face store in a new location. Vail also plans to add a new restaurant in the village, where work will begin this spring and summer.
