HOT NEWS FLASH! The NASTAR race and PACRAT races scheduled for this weekend (January 7-8) have been canceled due to low snow levels that might make racing hazardous.

If you want to ski Mt. Hood Meadows for only \$10 and benefit a good cause, the annual Rotary night is Monday, January 16 (MLK Day), from 2 pm to 9 pm. Tickets are available at Hillcrest Sports, 2506 SE Burnside, Gresham. Note that even if you are already a Meadows season ticket holder, you still need to purchase a Rotary ticket in order to participate in the special hours at Meadows for this fundraising event.

Mt. Bachelor has a special sale ending at 8 am on Mondy, January 9, or sooner if they sell out of this deal. Buy a 3-of-5 day lift ticket for only \$119 valid during MLK Weekend. A 3-of-5 day ticket is a multi-day ticket that is valid for 3 days of skiing/boarding within a 5-day period. At this \$119 rate, you can ski or ride 3 days for less than the regular price of a 2-day lift ticket... meaning that the 3rd day is FREE! Tickets will be available for use immediately, and the first day of the 3-day ticket must be used no later than Monday, January 16th. 2012 BACHELOR BLAST TRIP!!

Attention, Clubs! It's now time to sign up for the 2012 Bachelor Blast trip to be held April 6-8, 2012! Sign up now so we don't have to release spots. The basic trip price this year is \$210, and includes some extras: you'll get two nights of lodging in a Mt. Bachelor Village condo, two lift

tickets to Mt. Bachelor, a fabulous lasagne lunch at Mt. Bachelor on Saturday, and a fantastic party on Saturday night! If you want to ski a third day you can get a discounted price, and an extra night's lodging can be arranged if you have a full condo.

This year we are staying in Ski House Loft condos (4 per condo) or luxury River Ridge condos (7-8 per condo; 3 BR w/queens, 3 BA; sofa sleeper) at Mt. Bachelor Village on Century Drive. Trip leader Linda McGavin will work with your club to put your members into condos that fit your needs, if you wish to book a full condo. Only people who sign up in groups of 7-8 people will be put into the River Ridge condos. ALL guests have access to the Athletic Club of Bend!

Seniors and juniors will get extra discounts: Seniors 65-69 or Teens 13-18 can deduct \$15; Super Seniors 70+ or Youths 6-12 can deduct \$35; and children 5-12 can deduct \$45 from the basic trip price! Children are welcome on this trip as long as you fill a condo with the minimum number of people who agree to lodge together – we will not assign adults into a condo with children.

The bad news: **We only have 80 spots available** at these incredible prices – so you'll need to book early and contact trip leader Linda McGavin to work out the best condo(s) for your club members. Like other trips, individual club members can sign up directly and will be assigned lodging if they don't have a preference of roommates. So sign up early!

And the good news: Your club or group can still participate even after all of our basic trip spots are sold (or even if you would rather stay in a luxury home or different type of unit), because Mt. GUEST SPEAKERS AT DECEMBER MEETING:

SKI TO DEFEAT ALS: Fred Noble, a Mt. Hood "institution" who has been skiing Mt. Hood and the world for too many years to count, and a friend of many in our clubs, came to speak about a cause that is near and dear to his heart. In early 2010 Fred was asked to assist with starting up a new fundraiser for the ALS Association, a cause which became personal when he himself was diagnosed with ALS in December of 2010. This event is being launched to raise much needed funds for all families in Oregon and SW Washington who are coping with the daily struggles of living with ALS. Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease, is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that slowly robs a person of the ability to walk, speak, swallow and, eventually, breathe. With no known cause or cure, a person can expect to live typically 2 to 5 years from the time of diagnosis. ALS has no racial, ethnic or socioeconomic boundaries - and in only 10% of cases there is a family history of ALS. Today, there are approximately 30,000 people in the US living with ALS and 5,600 people in the US are diagnosed each and every year. At any given time, there are an estimated 500 families living with ALS in Oregon and SW Washington. Without any government or insurance funding, the local ALS chapter provides support services and equipment free of charge to support these families.

Fred is the honorary chairman of this new event, to be held April 14, 2012, at Mt. Hood Meadows. PACRAT is working on safety this year. Included will be a focus on course maintenance, with instructions given to racers on how to "slip" the course to smooth it out, and mandatory course slipping. The result will be an easier and safer course for everyone. Shadowing the course will result in disqualification.
