If you still don't know what a FWSA convention is, see the very informative document ("Convention 101") with answers to FAQ's specially prepared by Sheri Parshall, Chairman of the convention committee attached to the electronic version

of this newsletter and on the NWSCC website. Sheri continues to look for volunteers for various committees and events for this year's FWSA Convention - now less than TWO months away! The deadline for the early registration price is \$135 if received before April 30, \$160 if received after April 30 but before May 27, and \$175 if received after May 27, so hurry and get registered now! This heavily subsidized registration price includes the silent auction on Friday night, breakfast, lunch, and a banquet dinner/dance ("Forever Flannel") on Saturday, an eye opener party and delicious brunch on Sunday, the Travel Carousel with industry representatives on Saturday morning (think a chance to book your next club trip or to find out about places you might like to go!), educational sessions related to ski clubs, the chance to meet celebrities and Olympic ski racers, and more!!

Hotel information is also available on the site, with a link directly to book the hotel rooms at The Westin at the reduced price of \$137/night (per ROOM) versus the regular rate of \$285/night! The group rate is only available until May 11, 2008, and if the block fills up early the special rates will be gone. This hotel is 4 blocks from the Meydenbauer Center where convention events will be held.

Skiyente has started a ball rolling by committing to donate items for the goodie bags to be given to convention attendees, and other clubs are encouraged to do the same! We would need 400 items to fill the bags. Clubs are encouraged to plan official club trips to attend this local convention; you only get a chance about once every five years to attend a convention in our "home turf"!

FWSA Travel has planned an Alaska cruise June 8-15, immediately following the convention! RECAP, MARCH NWSCC MEETING:

Our main topic of conversation was the upcoming FWSA convention - see details above and the attached fliers.

TRAVEL/AIRLINE ISSUE: A huge new issue affecting ski club travel is raising its head following the announcement by United Airlines that it will start charging \$25 for a second checked bag. This was discussed at the meeting, and appeals went out via e-mail for clubs to become involved with writing letters to the airlines protesting this new policy and urging other airlines NOT to follow suit. In addition, United and US Air have already increased their rates, and Delta is adding a fuel surcharge to flight prices. FWSA has involved Congressman Mark Udall in this issue. Mary received many comments and copies of e-mails and letters sent, and prepared a handout which is attached to the electronic transmittal of this newsletter and available on the NWSCC website. All clubs should keep advised and try to follow through with their own letters and e-mails to the airlines to let them know we are serious about not using airlines that have this type of discriminatory policy.

Here is some further information from that e-letter:

Four Airlines have now aligned themselves with the extra baggage charge, United, US Airways, American and Continental. Only Southwest has publicly refused to do so publicly (the public being me in response to a letter). As you may have also heard three of the smaller, economy carriers have declared an end to passenger business (including Aloha serving Hawaii). More may be on the cusp. All claim fuel prices for the cutbacks/new charges. Mike Sanford

Be advised that effective April 1 Delta will implement a \$3 curb administrative fee and increase other fees and charges. These changes, which are effective immediately, are due to record fuel costs and business decisions reflecting today's economic landscape. Other fees include: Unaccompanied Minor Fee, Oversize Baggage Fee of \$100, Fee for Pets in Cabin of \$75 each way, Pets as Checked Baggage \$150 each way and others.

It was pretty amazing to be able to do that given the drastically different snow & weather conditions between the two days. And Luis Martinez was able to ski each run with the exact same handicap (20); a feat that's never been accomplished in the previous nineteen years!

Harald Harb's Primary Movements Teaching System

Harald Harb is a former member of the PSIA National Demo Team, which means that he was one of the best skier/instructors in the world. Because the PSIA approach to ski instruction did not keep pace with the development of modern ski technologies, Harb left PSIA and developed his own method of instruction, the Primary Movements Teaching System (PMTS). This is a far more sophisticated teaching system than ATS. PMTS includes both remedial exercises for experienced skiers with crippling habits caused by ATS training, as well as a program for new skiers that enables them to go directly to parallel skiing. Harb's latest book, **Essential of Skiing**, available online at (<http://www.harbskissystems.com/publications.htm>), details his PMTS methods.
