Our special guest speaker at the January Council meeting was Nancy Chin, Director of the OREGON CANCER SKI-OUT. We learned a lot about the background of this 2-day event at Mt. Hood Meadows, traditionally held the first Sunday and Monday in March (for better pricing). The 2006 event (the 18th annual) will be held March 5-6, 2006. This all-volunteer event was created in memory of family and friends lost to cancer, and all proceeds go to support cancer research. Last year the event raised the most money ever-\$40,000 - which was shared among the OHSU Cancer Center, Willamette Falls Hospice, and the Candlelighters (who help families with children dealing with cancer). The funds are donated with no restrictions, so the beneficiaries can put them to the greatest use.

This "racing" event is one of the most fun events of the ski season, even for people who don't usually race, because the winners of this event are not the fastest racers, but those who show the most consistency in their races on Sunday and Monday. Sunday night lodging and party will be held at the Best Western Hood River Inn (a NWSCC bronze commercial

member). Call early for reservations - 1-800-828-7873 - they go fast!

Each member of the top ten teams win great prizes, starting with skis, poles, and bindings for the top team. Costumes are often worn the first day (sometimes pretty wild!). All meals are included, and there is a dance and auction on Sunday night.

The early bird registration fee was \$850 for a team of 5; but is now \$1,000. However, if you have a NEW team, you can still get the early bird registration price of \$850 through February 10. Single and want to race? Pay \$170 and Nancy Chin will find you a team. Want to participate by volunteering? There are places available for 4-5 more volunteers this year. SAFETY

To highlight National Safety Awareness Week, Mary Olhausen passed around a special new logo designed by Teresa "T" Barnes of the North Island Snowdrifters (San Diego Council), winner of the FWSA Safety Contest at the 2005 convention. She has come up with an organization called "Hearing U Inc." The logo shows an ear and a question mark, and is designed to be worn on the back of a hearing-challenged sports participant to let others know that the person will not be able to hear any shouted warnings, such as "on the left" as you plan to pass them. Currently the logo is being promoted to a few ski resorts and hopefully we'll see it on skiers who are hearing impaired. Her idea is that it does not have to be limited to use at ski areas, but could be used in large companies and factories, etc. Watch for more about this great idea!

If you carry a portable radio and get into difficulty, you could **switch your radio channel to 9-11** and try a call for assistance. The Ski Patrols at many (but not all) areas are monitoring that channel for emergencies. This is an idea that should be shared and spread around - with so many radios

being used these days, this might be one of the best ways to deal with "on the hill" emergencies.

A recent incident with the State Patrol on the way to Mt. Hood led one of our club members to advise that he received a warning for not leaving his blinker on long enough after changing lanes. Sylvia Kearns advised that the rule is "7 blinks" before and after you change lanes. With more patrols in Mt. Hood's "Safety Corridor," this is one more thing to watch out for to stay safe and ticket-free.

A VICTORY FOR TIMBERLINE!!

Jon Tullis of Timberline has just advised us that they have the final green light on the Timberline Express Chairlift proposal, having received a positive record of decision to go forward with Alternative 3 of the EIS and having got through the appeal period without a single appeal. They are planning to clear the trails this summer and build the lift next summer, and can hardly wait to open up some exciting new terrain for NW skiers!! Thanks to all skiers who expressed their support for this project!!


