SKI OREGON AND SKI WASHINGTON CHALLENGES: Back for its second year is the Ski Oregon Challenge. Ski 9 out of 11 ski areas in Oregon during the 2006-07 ski season and you could win equipment, services, or lift tickets for Oregon ski areas. Extra credit will be given for the 2 optional areas: Spout Springs & Warner Canyon.

NWSCC is expanding its Ski Challenge to the 14 ski areas in the State of Washington. To meet the Challenge you have to ski/ride at least 10 of these during the ski season. If you ski 10 of the 14 ski areas in Washington during the 2006-07 ski season you could win equipment, services or lift tickets for Washington ski areas. Extra credit will be given for the 4 optional areas: Hurricane Ridge, Leavenworth, North Cascade Heli-Skiing and Cascade Powder Cats.

GUEST SPEAKERS, DECEMBER MEETING:

RACING was the main topic of this meeting, as it was the deadline for club teams to sign up with PACRAT. PACRAT racing is for everyone; our racing format is unique among the race leagues belonging to FWSA. Randy Lew, President of FWSA, told us that all the other leagues run one racer at a time in true slalom and true GS races, longer than the "recreational" races put on by PACRAT. PACRAT uses shorter courses with two people racing against each other. As mentioned in the PACRAT racing section below, potential racers for the Far West Racing Association championships to be held at Mt. Bachelor March 30-April 1 can qualify by racing 3 qualifying races, which can include PACRAT courses. You can also qualify by racing at FWSA ski week races, or at the Skiyente Masters Races to be held March 3-4, 2007.

Interested in training? **Mountain High Snowsport Club** has 3 free training sessions for its members. You can sign up for the **MAC Masters Ski Training Programs** at a price of \$150 for 4 sessions or \$200 for 6 sessions. The training is offered various Saturdays and Sundays in January and February 2007 for both "Basic Training" and "Masters Ski Racing" programs. Others at the meeting shared their thoughts on racing: Gary Gunderson says that newcomers will have fun and get better every time, and that everyone from snowplowers to elite racers can participate. Stevie Viaene praised the team building, camaraderie, and overall fun. Dale Parshall, the scorekeeper for PACRAT, said that only the best of 2 runs is scored, participants get 1 point just for racing, and 3 bonus points if they improve their handicap. It is often the newcomers who score top points for their team! suggested having the experienced team members show newcomers how to ski around the gates, and to stress that they MUST cross their own finish line. PACRAT usually runs 150 racers through its courses, and finishes for the day around 1:00. Racers get discounted lift tickets at the ski areas on race day, and an after-race party is held starting around 3:00. Snowboarders and telemark skiers are welcome to race (snowboarders get a 10% "break" on their time), but they must do ALL their races in the same format. It is good racer etiquette to sideslip the course and help keep it smooth for the other races, but be sure NOT to go through the finish line! Be courteous, be patient, and help out if needed. [Note that FWRA races are different: there is NO slipping the courses, and NO going through the gates.]

The first PACRAT race of the season will be at Timberline on January 14, followed by a party at the Mt. Hood Museum in Government Camp. Racers must bring their racing bibs to get in free; guests are \$10 for the party.

A charitable donation will be made by FWSA in the name of the winning club or council and FWSA to a charity designated by the winning club or council. The designated charity must "qualify" by providing proof to FWSA that it is a valid 501(c)(3) charitable organization in order to receive the funds. \$50 will be awarded to a qualified charity of choice for first place in each class, for Wentworth Outstanding publication and Outstanding Website. \$100 will be awarded to a qualified charity of choice for first place winners in each class, for Tollakson Outstanding Club of the Year. Bergfreunde is planning two major ski trips this coming season which will be open to other club members, one to Whistler and one to Utah (February 3-10, 2007), and they have a number of shorter trips as well. Deposits should be made promptly, as the international European trips tend to sell out early!! \$200 deposits are required, and are nonrefundable.
