## **RECAP, OCTOBER NWSCC MEETING:**

A large and enthusiastic crowd welcomed **Matthew Drake**, Chairman and CEO of **Mt. Hood Meadows Ski Resort**, to the October Council meeting. Accompanying Matthew were Dave Tragethon, who is extremely well known to us, and George Evans, a new Co-Sales Manager who will be dealing with corporate and midweek groups at the new Meadows Sales office in Clackamas. A group is 15 or more people.

"Peak" weekend and holiday shift lift tickets this year are going to be \$64! The name of the game to save money is "midweek," and Meadows is doing many things to encourage off-peak visits to the mountain to alleviate peak weekend crowding. One midweek group special for only \$49 includes a lift ticket or a beginner learn to ski or snowboard package, and lunch!

Special park and ride programs will also encourage midweek travel to Meadows.

There are other ways to save on daily lift tickets prices. Staying at partner lodging in the Hood River Valley, including Cooper Spur Resort, which is owned by Mt. Hood Meadows, allows you to buy lift tickets for only \$32 (or you can receive FREE midweek lift tickets if you stay at Cooper Spur Sunday-Thursday non-holiday nights). A ten-time pass can be purchased for \$330, or for only \$295 if bought at the NWSCC Ski Fair or through a group of 10 or 20. The very popular 4x4, 3x3, and 2x2 program allows adults, teens, and juniors to buy season passes online in groups for only \$400, \$300, or \$200, but this special ENDS November 4!

Speaking of Cooper Spur, this is one of the most affordable and fun places to take a family on Mt. Hood! And the Cooper Spur Steakhouse offers excellent food with many holiday specials. If you don't want to cook this Thanksgiving, make a reservation at the Steakhouse - groups of 8 or more will get their own personal turkey, and get to take the leftovers home!

This year being Meadows' 40th Anniversary, the theme is "**40 Years of Making Winter Fun**" and there are MANY specials, especially during January, the official anniversary month. If your birthday falls on a ski day in the 2007-08 ski season, you will get 40% off one item soft goods in the shops. Meadows has managed to talk Moe Dixon out of traveling to Colorado this winter, and he will play at the Finish Line during Christmas (December 27 - 30), and weekends in January and February, preceded by an hour of playing for the children (kids LOVE to dance to Moe!). Moe has been playing for windsurfers and skiers for many years, and is an incredible one man show. Matthew Drake spoke about Meadows' commitment to safety, which earned it a **National Safety Award** from the National Ski Areas Association for its "Are You Aware" program which emphasizes on-mountain awareness, responsibility, and safety. A brand new ski patrol headquarters building has been built this summer south of the top of the Blue Chair, and a larger patrol emphasizes the commitment to safety. Meadows has 3 cardiac sleds which can resuscitate a heart patient on the hill and radio information wirelessly to the Medical Clinic, which is staffed by Providence physicians. All of Meadows' employees are required to learn the 7 items in the Skier/Rider Responsibility Code - and everyone should know these safety rules and is encouraged to share them with "unaware" people who are creating a danger to themselves and others.

Now for a little politics and a **CALL TO ACTION** from Northwest Snowsports Advocates - formed by NWSCC to keep skiers informed about ski area development and provide tips on how to get involved in ski area expansion efforts which are often stopped by small but vocal groups of opponents when the true users of the ski areas do not make their voices heard. Several years ago Mt. Hood Meadows announced plans to develop a destination resort at its property at Cooper Spur. This announcement met with strong opposition by local groups and residents in the Hood River Valley. Many hours of meetings and negotiations resulted in a solution acceptable to all groups, a land swap by Meadows of all of its Cooper Spur holdings (approximately 775 acres) for two parcels of recreation-zoned land owned by the US Forest Service just outside of Government Camp, one 80 acre parcel to the west of town and another 40 acre parcel to the east. The Hood River Resident's Committee selected an appraiser from three appraisers referred by the US Forest Service. All parties approved the appraisals and a draft settlement was achieved.

The groups worked with the House of Representatives to include provisions which added more wilderness areas to Mt. Hood, and benefitted all the parties, and **House Bill 5025** (the **Mt. Hood Stewardship Legacy Act**) was passed. The bill then went to the Senate, where it was allowed to expire in committee. After an extremely long delay (rendering the initial appraisal invalid after 12 months had passed) it reappeared as Senate Bill 647, which gutted all the negotiated provisions of HB 5025, including provisions for usage fees to be retained by the Mt. Hood National Forest for recreation use, provisions which would aid the Oregon Department of Transportation in maintaining and reconstructing Highway 35 at White River, provisions important to the Warm Springs Tribe protecting their tribal hunting and fishing rights, provisions protecting the Crystal Springs Watershed, and the Cooper Spur land swap. Instead, the bill basically added 140,000 acres of new wilderness territory to Mt. Hood. The groups who had worked so hard on the settlement were stunned, and are trying to reach Senator Wyden to express their disapproval and their desires that the provisions of HB 5025 be considered. **We urge skiers and snowboarders, as well as all recreational users of the Mt. Hood National Forest, to join with NWSCC in this CALL FOR ACTION as described in a thorough manner on the NWSCC/Northwest Snowsports Advocates webpage at [www.nwskiers.org/nwsa/resort/mthoodmeadows.htm](http://www.nwskiers.org/nwsa/resort/mthoodmeadows.htm).** This is possibly one of the most important issues on which recreational uses of Mt. Hood may ever have the opportunity to make their voices heard.

If Meadows is not allowed to proceed with the land swap, it will again be looking to develop its property at Cooper Spur into a high quality, family friendly recreational area. Meadows does not desire to put lodging slopeside at Mt. Hood Meadows, but

wants to put it where it has the least impact on the environment while providing exceptional recreational and mountain hospitality experiences for guests and visitors.

#### **Club Information Exchange:**

Good news! Heather and Ryan Brown are back as managers/chefs at **Cascade Ski Club Lodge** in the heart of Government Camp!! They are both trained chefs, and the food is again going to be awesome - come to the annual Open House on December 1 from 6-10 pm to taste the food, see the Lodge, and maybe win a prize! Please RSVP to 503-272-9204 to assist them in preparations. There has been lots of updating at Cascade Lodge - new furniture, redone bunk rooms (smaller numbers of bunks per room and some family rooms), food will be available Friday and Saturday nights, and there will be a new security system with cards to get into the Lodge. Cascade is the most family friendly club in the Portland area! The \$50 initiation fee will be waived for members of any other NWSCC club; the dues are \$100 for head of household, \$30 for the spouse, and \$25 for each child. Members are entitled to stay in the bunks at the Lodge for \$12 for adults and \$7 for children. Members can park for free in the Lodge's parking lot without the need for snow park permits. **Trip to FWRA Racing Championships, Mammoth Mountain, California, April 3-6, 2008:** Gordon Lusk is arranging for a bus from the Reno airport (time tba) on Thursday night, April 3. Participants will arrange their own transportation to Reno (suggested flights will be provided once the actual flight schedules are known). The expected trip cost of \$382 (based on 40 people) will receive the bus ride and four nights' lodging at the Shilo Inn in Mammoth Village, with a return to the Reno Airport on Monday, April 7. (This MAY be changed to a 3-night trip, leaving on Sunday after the race awards.) Once in Mammoth there are shuttle buses around town. FWRA will have discount lift tickets available to ski at the aptly-named Mammoth Mountain, which offers 32 lifts over 3,500+ acres of terrain ranging from beginner to awesome steeps. Mammoth is famous for excellent spring snow, and this is a great time for anyone from the Northwest to find out - you do not need to be a racer to come on this trip!

## **FWSA TRIPS:**

**SKI WEEK 2008:** FWSA is going to **Whistler, BC, Canada, January 19-26, 2008!** NWSCC has filled its 50 spots on this trip, but you can still sign up. A \$100 check will hold your place on the waiting list; as vacancies come up they will be offered to people in the order their checks were received. If you do not get on the trip your uncashed check will be returned to you. The trip price is \$1049 for condos or \$1,109 for hotel for 7 nights of luxury lodging (double occupancy), a 6-day lift ticket good at both Whistler and Blackcomb, Welcome Party, Apres Ski Party, Mountain Picnic, a Council Night event, 3 optional races, and a Farewell Party. NWSCC was unable to get enough people to take a bus on this trip. If you want to fly, the cost is approximately \$355 from Portland and \$433 from Eugene. **Payment in full is now due.** Be sure to arrange for your passport well in advance; they are REQUIRED; and make sure you have adequate medical insurance. FWSA's **2008 European Ski Week** will be at **Les Trois Vallees, France**, from **March 7-15, 2008**, at a cost of \$1,390 per person including air from LAX, SFO, and SEA. Lodging will be at a ski-in, ski-out hotel located between Meribel and Courchevel. There will be a post-trip extension of 3 nights at Aix-en-Provence and 4 nights in Paris at a cost of \$895 per person. A \$200 deposit is required for EACH of these two trips.
