FWSA AWARDS PROGRAMS AT FWSA CONVENTION - SUBMISSION DEADLINE MARCH 20!!: With NWSCC hosting this year's FWSA Convention, we would like to see MANY of our clubs entering the awards competitions and sending their members to Convention. There are no opportunities quite like this for your club to gain recognition for its accomplishments!

The easiest entries for your club are for Outstanding Newsletter and Outstanding Website, and while it is a bit more effort to prepare an Outstanding Club Application, your club will be judged against other clubs of the same size throughout FWSA, and it is really fun to WIN! With the entries you need to submit the name of someone from your club who will act as a judge in the category you are entering; it's easy because the judge will only need to look at 2 club's newsletters or websites.

Your club can also enter the "Club & Council Historical Recognition" Program with a history of your club - potential museum or library reference resources!

Is your club active in community service or charitable activities? Then enter the "Charities and Our Community Service Recognition" program for the chance to be one of 3 clubs to receive checks to be donated to the charity of your choice!

Individual awards that are well worth entering are for the following awards:

Safety Person of the Year Award: Any ski club or council can nominate any club member. The prize is an all expense paid trip for TWO to Aspen/Snowmass, including airfare, luxury lodging, skiing, demos, and is a fantastic trip! Isn't there someone in your club who has done special things to promote safety? Take the steps to enter them - Oregon has had TWO winners of this prize so far!!

Western Ski Heritage Award: The prize for this award is a 5-night ski package for two at Steamboat with lodging, lift tickets, rentals, tours, lessons, and a lunch (no airfare), and an engraved crystal trophy. The award recognizes the best effort in the prior year that finds, preserves, documents and shares the history of snowsports in the West. The award is open to an individual, a group, or a team and can be self-nominated or nominated by a club or club member. This award is not restricted to FWSA club members.

CLUB WEB/NEWSLETTER CHALLENGE CONTEST EXTENDED TO MARCH 31!! NWSCC

wants to encourage all clubs to promote FWSA, the 2014 FWSA Convention in Bend, and NWSCC on their websites and in their newsletters, and is offering a prize worth \$308!! The club delegates must pay the registration in advance, and the club will be reimbursed for two delegates (at \$154 each) after the convention. The offer cannot be combined with any other promotion, i.e., the FWSA "six pack" program.

RECAP OF FEBRUARY 19 MEETING:

Our guest speakers at the February 19 meeting were Julie Mayfield and Aubrey McCauley from The ALS Association Oregon and SW Washington Chapter; Michelle Satter of Oregon Cancer Ski Out (held March 9-10); and Carla Zenner, a CPR training specialist.

Michelle told us details of the Oregon Cancer Ski Out, which just concluded on March 10 and raised thousands of dollars for cancer research, hospice, etc. The coaches who help the racers to achieve their goals once again included Phil and Steve Mahre, among other dedicated racing coaches from around the Pacific Northwest.

Julie and Aubrey spoke about the upcoming third annual Ski to Defeat ALS event to be held April 12, 2014, at Mt. Hood Meadows. The format is a vertical challenge, with prizes for the most vertical feet skied and for fundraising, but the event is open to everyone, whether they ski/ride 2 runs or 200 runs. The entry fee is \$75 (\$25 for Mt. Hood Meadows season passholders), but all participants are required to fundraise a minimum of \$150 for the cause. Participants receive breakfast and lunch at Meadows, and enjoy live music (this year's band is "Catch and Release"), and many fun events during the day. ALS partners with Oregon Adaptive Sports to allow ALS patients to ski that day - one year a father was able to ski with his children for the first time!

The monies raised support LOCAL families in Oregon and Southwest Washington - all of their services are free to families who are living with ALS. They loan durable medical equipment, such as voice technology for when the person's voice fails; and offer all types of support to help give the best quality of life to ALS patients and teach them how to LIVE with ALS, not to die from ALS. Carla Zenner is a former instructor who was with Portland Parks & Recreation for 10 years teaching First Aid/CPR/AED (Adult/Pediatric), and in her retirement has created the Carla Zenner Training Center, carlazenner.com, to help train and certify people in CPR, AED, and other programs. Carla told us that people are often hesitant to help out in a medical emergency, but stressed that time is of the essence and every second counts to save someone's life. The absolute first thing to do is to call 911; then assess if someone is having a heart attack and start chest compressions (30 chest compressions and 2 breaths. though now there are some recommendations of just continuing the chest compressions). Carla showed us a sample AED, and said that if an AED (automated external defibrillator) is available that the instructions are very simple and lead you through step by step. Carla offers a variety of classes, and will offer classes to clubs for \$45 per person (reduced from \$55 per

person) for the Pediatric Plus class which will include a two-year certification. [Note that Bergfreunde offers CPR training to its hike leaders, and other clubs might like to consider having trip leaders do the same.] Carla's Medic First Aid course can be taken at your leisure, with approximately 2 hours of video online, followed by a meeting with Carla for 1-1/2 hours. There was a discussion of the Good Samaritan law, which protects people who attempt to help someone until they are physically exhausted against being sued. Carla also talked about medical issues caused by diabetes, frostbite, and stroke. If you think someone is having a stroke (possibly their face is drooping), ask them to smile or to squeeze your hands, as they won't be able to do that. Chances are that they will deny any problem, and you should insist that they get immediate medical help, as the longer a person goes without treatment after a stroke, the less chance that they will be able Carla can be reached through her to recover. website. at 503-913-2053 or email cmzenner@msn.com.

April 12, 2014 Ski to Defeat ALS, Mt. Hood Meadows, a fundraiser for ALS (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis, commonly known as Lou Gehrig's Disease), which is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that slowly robs a person of the ability to walk, speak, swallow and, eventually, breathe. Fred Noble, who is living with ALS himself, is the local spokesperson. In the past two years, they have been able to collectively raise over \$330,000, and are hoping that this third year will bring the total raised to half a million dollars in the fight against ALS. The monies from this event bring hands on services to local families living with this disease and also fund research. Go to

From February FWSA NEWS:

Far West Athletes' Winning Ways: Our athletes are keeping busy this season with races from Sun Valley to Stevens Pass and have been burning up the hill. Kayleigh MacGregor, Kye Moffat, Alexandria Oseland (supported by NWSCC), Cai Yamamoto (supported by Mountain High Snowsport Club of Portland, OR), Lila Lapanja, Riley Plant, Molly Leavens, Hannah Hunsaker, and Samantha Busby have all won podium time over the past months with their impressive races. These kids are all great examples of future Olympians. We'll be seeing their names in the IOC records one day soon. We will be watching for great results the rest of the season!

The foregoing successes by our athletes are due in part to the generosity and support from our Far West membership, through donations to the Far West Ski Foundation.

Vern Sprock Scholarship: Vern Sprock, developer and operator of Sierra Ski Ranch for 40 years, died February 10 at age 93 in a nursing home in Montana. Vern and his late wife Bobbie were honored as Snowsports Builders during the 2013 FWSA convention. His daughter Kathy and son Peter are creating a multi-year scholarship in their father's name through the Foundation for the FWSA Athletic Scholarship Program.

Rehab and Adaptive Grants: Acknowledgments of Foundation grants have been received from the Vail Veterans Program and the Snowbasin Adaptive Sports Education Foundation (SASEF). During the January 2014 Family Program, January 26 - 30, 2014, the Vail Veterans Program hosted 24 wounded United States military service members, their spouses and family, which included 43 children. They planned a second ski trip during the first week in March.

"PROTECT OUR WINTERS" LAUNCHES THE POW RIDER'S ALLIANCE: Protect Our Winters announces the launch of the POW Riders Alliance, a group of 53 of the world's top alpine, nordic and freeskiers, snowboarders, mountaineers, and polar explorers, all committed to fighting climate change. "Professional athletes are the core of Protect Our Winters – arguably, no other group has better first-hand experience with the progression of climate change and its impacts on global snowpack and mountainous regions, and certainly no other group has a greater cultural influence on the global winter sports community," says Chris Steinkamp, POW executive director.

The group is comprised of global athletes including Olympians Gretchen Bleiler, Kikkan Randall, Nate Holland, Callan Chythlook-Sifsof, Andrew Newell and Steven Nyman, pro snowboarders Nicolas Muller, Danny Davis, Arielle Gold

and Jamie Anderson, freeskiers Chris Davenport, Ingrid Backstrom and Kit Deslauriers, mountaineers/explorers Emily Harrington and Eric Larsen. Also joining the group is Wang Lei, a professional snowboarder from Beijing, China. See the entire list at http://protectourwinters.org/riders-alliance. "As a group, we're touching every remote corner of the world at any given time, seeing climate change impacts in various ways," states World Cup skier and US Olympian, Steven Nyman. "Climate change is affecting our lives and careers and it's in our best interest to use our passion to mobilize the community and bring a new perspective to the policy discussion." The POW Riders Alliance was developed as a central platform for athletes to speak out and create a social movement against climate change. For example, POW recently led a group of 17 athletes and brand representatives to Washington, D.C. for meetings with US Senators and has reached over 20,000 young students with a message of climate action delivered by pro athletes. POW believes that by combining the athletes' passion with their influence, first-hand experience and immense media reach, it represents a new, powerful approach to environmental advocacy. The Riders Alliance launched an initiative to call attention to climate change on the world's largest sports stage in Sochi, Russia in partnership with a group of graduate students from the Yale School of Forestry.

VAIL ADDS JAPAN'S NISEKO TO EPIC PASS RESORT

LIST: Vail Resorts has added Niseko, Japan to its list of Epic Pass resorts. Beginning in 2014-2015 Epic Pass holders can ski five free days at Niseko, Japan, as well as unlimited, unrestricted skiing in Vail Resorts properties in Colorado, Utah, and Tahoe, on the Epic Pass. The 2014-2015 The Epic Pass will be available for purchase beginning March 10, 2014, at epicpass.com. In 2008, Forbes crowned Niseko one of the Top 10 International Ski Resorts, and more recently, National Geographic voted

Niseko as the best powder snow resort in the world. The resort boasts an average 590 inches of snow per year. Niseko is located 100 kilometers south of Japan's fifth largest city, Sapporo, in the southwest corner of the northern Japanese island of Hokkaido, Niseko Annupuri is a part of the Niseko-Shakotan-Otaru Kaigan Quasi-National Park and is the most eastern park of the Niseko Volcanic Group.

WHISTLER GONDOLA UPGRADE: Whistler Blackcomb's 26-year-old Village Gondola will be upgraded for the 2014-15 season with new eight-passenger cabins. The \$6 million transportation investment represents half of a \$12 expansion program announced for next season. The new cabins will improve capacity by 12 percent through four additional cabins and greater loading efficiency. An additional \$5.9 million has been allocated to information technology initiatives, including a new radio-frequency identification (RFID) system with lift access control gates on most lifts.

LAKE LOUISE "WORLD'S MOST SCENIC": Lake Louise ski resort near Banff in Alberta has been named the most scenic ski resort in the world by USA Today, which described the famous center in the Canadian Rockies as, "unsurpassed with postcard perfect beauty." Located in the Banff National Park UNESCO World Heritage Site, Lake Louise is renowned the world over for stunning panoramic views of endless, towering mountain peaks, sparkling glaciers and the shimmering lake itself.

VAIL AND FOREST SERVICE DESTROY SMOKE **SHACKS**: (so much for "Rocky Mountain High") Vail Resorts and the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) have confirmed that a number of smoke shacks for marijuana use at Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge and Keystone resorts have been destroyed over the past several weeks noting that, in spite of the passage of Amendment 64 last fall, public consumption of marijuana continues to be illegal under Colorado law and possession and consumption of marijuana continues to be illegal under federal law. Vail Resorts' four Colorado ski resorts - Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge and Keystone are located on U.S. Forest Service land, where possession and consumption of marijuana is illegal. In addition, using any ski lift or ski slope or trail while under the influence of drugs and alcohol is prohibited under the Colorado Ski Safety and there is also "no smoking" of any kind permitted in any Vail Resorts owned and operated facilities, including restaurants, lodges and hotels, and officials will continue to enforce that policy.
