PACRAT NEWS:

Congratulations to "On the Edge," the new Mountain High team which ended up as the PACRAT championship team this year! Also, congratulations to Ken Price and Megan Cassidy for being "crowned" King Rat and Queen

Dale Parshall, Race Director, reported: "We got all five races in! Thanks to Meadows and Timberline for doing all they could to allow us to do that. Also, thanks to the board, race crew and all of our racers for helping to pull it off. Remembering that we count the best 4 out of 5 races for each racer, On The Edge added only 19 points to their race 4 total, but it was enough to hold off Avalanche Express (adding 53 points to jump from 3rd to 2nd) and Ragnar's Rangers (also adding 53 points to jump from 3rd to a tie for 2nd). Racy Brats added 50 points to move from 8th to 5th, and Oui Ski added 75 points to its race 4 total to move from 13th to 6th.

"King and Queen Rat are awards to racers who show the most consistent and greatest improvement over the course of the season. This year's King Rat is Ken Price (Mixed Nuts), who improved his handicap every race but one and showed an overall improvement of 54%. Queen Rat is Megan Cassidy (Oui Ski) who showed improvement every race and had an overall improvement of 41%. For race 5, Steve Sarich edged Peter Dodd to claim his second fastest man on the hill title. On the ladies' side, Masha Los reclaimed

the fastest woman on the hill title. See the last page [of the report on the PACRAT website] for the usual annual statistics and please note the correlation between participation and final team standings. Feel free to give the board suggestions to make things better. See you next year."

trip will be a 3-night roundtrip paddleboat cruise aboard the American Queen from New Orleans. It will be a "Southern Culture Cruise" with stops at Oak Alley Plantation and Baton Rouge,



LA. The trip includes all meals, wine/beer with dinner, soft drinks, water, and coffee. Also included is 1 night at a local hotel before the cruise, transfers to the ship, steamboat-style entertainment, daily lectures, and a Welcome Party. Excerpts from FWSA NEWS FLASH:

SQUAW VALLEY PLANS BASE TO BASE GONDOLA CONNECTION WITH ALPINE MEADOWS: For years, Andy Wirth and Troy Caldwell have skied the North Lake Tahoe resorts of Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows together. Wirth is the President and CEO of Squaw, and Caldwell owns the 460 acres of private property that separates Squaw from its neighbor Alpine. And so their chairlift conversations led to the April 13 announcement that Squaw Valley Ski Holdings, LLC, plans to connect the two resorts with a base-to-base lift.

They aren't the first to imagine a connection between the resorts. Alpine's snowy bowls are easily spotted from Squaw's KT-22, a storied peak known for the steep terrain that spills down its north flank to the resort village. The physical connection moved closer to realization when KSL Capital Partners bought Squaw in 2010 and then merged that ski area with Alpine in 2011 to offer 6,000 acres of terrain on one pass. This recent announcement came after a legal agreement that allows Squaw to build and maintain a lift on Caldwell 's property, known as White Wolf. It's similar to an existing contract between the two parties: Squaw already leases Caldwell 's land atop KT-22 for resort operations. Guests currently move between Squaw and Alpine via a free shuttle. The proposed base-to-base gondola would be the first on-mountain infrastructure to link the two. "It's definitely a dream come true," says Caldwell.

\$50 MILLION DOLLAR MAKEOVER AT PARK CITY/CANYONS: The Park City Planning Commission gave unanimous approval for Vail Resorts' plan to build an interconnecting gondola between Park City and The Canyons ski areas, among other capital improvements totaling \$50 million. The end result will reportedly represent the largest single ski area in the U.S., with more than 7,300 acres of skiable terrain.

U.S. SKI AND SNOWBOARD HALL OF FAME INDUCTION

2015: America's Ski Town USA, Steamboat Springs, honored ten new inductees to the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame on April 11th. Those inductees included Olympic champion snowboarder Ross Powers, World Alpine

Championship medalist Erik Schlopy, noted big mountain skier Chris Davenport, ski instruction pioneer Curt Chase, and goggle innovator Bob Smith. Others include resort designer Joe Cushing, World Cup race winner Kristina Koznik, alpine development leader John McMurtry, women's innovator Jeannie Thoren and Ralph Miller, one of the great American ski racers from the 1950's.


