A NEW "EARLY BIRD" SPECIAL: "Have Vaccine, Will Travel". People over the age of 65 have been among the first in line to receive Covid-19 vaccinations. And they are leading a wave in new travel bookings. Across the United States, older people have been among the first in line to receive their Covid-19 vaccinations. And among hotels, cruise lines and tour operators, the data is clear: Older travelers are leading a wave in new travel bookings. Americans over 65, who have had priority access to inoculations, are now ready to go!
