NWSCC IS HOST COUNCIL FOR 2008 FWSA CONVENTION JUNE 5-8, 2008, IN BELLEVUE!!

Sheri Parshall, Chairman of the convention committee, continues to look for volunteers for various committees and events for next year's FWSA Convention. A well-attended meeting in Bellevue on August 18 gave us a good start with many volunteers from the Seattle-area clubs taking on some leadership roles. RECAP, AUGUST NWSCC MEETING:

Pat Stevens spoke to the group about the Mt. Hood Ski Patrol and their annual Golf Benefit (in honor of Lt. Colonel John Keyes). MHSP is the oldest ski patrol organization in the nation (70 years!). The all-volunteer MHSP's 2000+ members provides the sleds, radios, and all supplies for five first aid rooms at Mt. Hood Ski areas, as well as maintaining two buildings in Government Camp. They answer over a thousand calls for on-mountain help each year, 50% of which require high level search and rescue skills or advanced first aid. Members include not only the traditional and highly visible red coated full members on the mountain, but there are associate members (blue coats) manning the first aid rooms, a Nordic Patrol covering the backcountry, a Mountain Bike Patrol at Skibowl, and the MHSP has undertaken the Guest Host program at Timberline. There is a huge time commitment for members, as there is a need to be recertified each year in chairlift rescue, search and rescue, and first aid. On top of all this, members have to PAY to belong to MHSP and provide all this service. They would like to support the organization through fundraising activities rather than through member dues.

Their biggest fundraiser of the year is the 11th Annual Golf Benefit scheduled for September 9, 2007 at The Reserve Vineyards and Golf Club, Aloha, Oregon. The event includes a golf tournament (with many local corporations participating), a luncheon, raffle, and silent and oral auctions. Individual or team golfers are welcome at a cost of \$175 per golfer, which includes 18 holes of golf, a cart, refreshments on the course, the luncheon/awards party, and a tee gift bag. There are all types of special awards and prizes, including the chance to win a Harley for a hole in one! There are many opportunities for sponsorship or other donations to this event. Sheri Parshall reported that the **Mt. Hood Cultural Center and Museum** is now the official center for information for Clackamas County from the Mt. Hood Loop to Warm Springs. The County is providing some signs and funding for the

Museum. Throughout the summer there have been exhibits of wildlife art, Warm Springs basket art, and there have been art, jewelry making, and blacksmith classes at the historic Steiner Log Cabins. Ski clubs should take note that they are welcome to store their historic records at the Museum; note that Skiyente Ski Club lost many of its older records in a house fire years ago. The executor of the estate of Jean Sauberg, a former Olympian from Oregon who recently passed away, may donate some of Jean's medals to be displayed at the Museum - all because of an article written by Sheri several years ago in our Northwest Skiers' Directory!

The Museum will have its annual **Heritage Day** on **September 22, 2007**, with many exciting offerings, including an old time car rally, hikes, a fabulous silent auction, and a wonderful dinner. This event just gets better every year! Clubs are invited to have free booths at this event.

Other clubs should be aware that **Cascade Ski Club** with their lodge at Government Camp (and probably **Boeing SkiBacs** with their lodge at Crystal Mountain AND **Seattle Ski Club** with their lodge at Snoqualmie Pass) have lighter usage at their lodge in late spring (until late May when the ski camps come into Government Camp) and in the fall, and that these are the best times for other clubs to make arrangements to use these club facilities. Schnee Vogeli Ski Club will host its annual Pray for Snow Dance Saturday, November 10, at Charlie's in Government Camp. Tickets for this event are sold in advance by Schnee Vogeli members (they will be available at NWSCC meetings), and are NOT sold at the door - last year some people were turned away, so get your tickets early!

All members of all clubs in Far West Ski Association - and their children - are invited to attend **Skiyente Ski Club's third annual family ski trip**, which this year will be an "arrange your own transportation" trip to **Sun Valley, Idaho, February 6-10, 2008!** The cost is \$488 to \$688, depending upon the lodging chosen, and will include lodging, lifts, a welcome party, a race, family challenge bowling, and a dinner. Watch for further details as they become available. Sixty spots are available.

Mountain High Snowsport Club will be having two weekend bus trips next year, one a 3-day trip over Presidents' Weekend to ski Warner Canyon (near Lakeview), Mt. Shasta, and Mt. Ashland. The other trip is a "Mystery" trip March 14-16 where no one except the trip captains know where the trip will go until it actually leaves! Mountain High also has opened up to all other club members a special South Lake Tahoe Trip March 29-April 3. For only \$400 you get 5 nights at Lakeland Village in town homes, with a complimentary wine and cheese reception, daily continental breakfast, private shuttles around town and to the Heavenly gondola or tram, and a 2-out-of-3day lift ticket to Heavenly! (Transportation is not included.) Participants will be able to ski at other areas as well.

On top of that, you can extend this trip with an optional visit to **Mammoth Mountain** for the **Far West Race Championships**, which will be held **April 3-6, 2008**. Since you are already more than halfway there, you may be able to join a bus to Mammoth and receive bus transportation back to Reno at the end of that trip (if that's where you flew to). Watch for further details as they become available.

FWSA TRIPS

SKI WEEK 2008: FWSA is going to Whistler, BC, Canada, January 19-26, 2008! The trip price will be \$999 for condos or \$1,059 for hotel for 7 nights of luxury lodging (double occupancy), a 6-day lift ticket good at both Whistler and Blackcomb, Welcome Party, Apres Ski Party, Mountain Picnic, a Council Night event, 3 optional races, and a Farewell Party. If you want to fly, the cost is approximately \$355 from Portland and \$433 from Eugene. NWSCC is also working on arranging for bus transportation, which would take a minimum of 20 people from Eugene at a cost of \$160-200 each, and a minimum of 22 people from Portland at a cost of \$120-135 each (all depending upon the number of people on the bus - the fuller the bus, the cheaper the cost!). \$450 deposits are being taken now. See

attached/included flier for further details. NWSCC has filled its 50 spots on this trip, but you can still sign up. Be sure to arrange for your passport well in advance; they are REQUIRED; and make sure you have adequate medical insurance. Contact Barbara Bousum at 503-224-3584 or BBousum@gmail.com.

FWSA's 2008 European Ski Week will be at Les Trois Vallees, France, from March 7-15, 2008, at a cost of \$1,390 per person including air from LAX, SFO, and SEA. Lodging will be at a ski-in, ski-out hotel located between Meribel and Courchevel. There will be a post-trip extension of 3 nights at Aix-en-Provence and 4 nights in Paris at a cost of \$895 per person. A \$200 deposit is required for EACH of these two trips.
