NORTHWEST SNOWSPORTS ADVOCATES NEWS:

US 26 MOUNT HOOD HIGHWAY SAFETY PROJECT

The Oregon Department of Transportation is in the early stages of developing a project to improve safety on the Mt. Hood Highway (U.S. 26) just east of Rhododendron and west of Oregon Highway 35. Go to the online open house at www.us26mthoodsafetyopenhouse.org. This interactive tool includes a series of stations where you can learn more about the project. At the end of the open house you will have opportunities to provide comments. YOUR INPUT CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE!! Thank you for participating!!

The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) will be implementing several safety improvements on Highway 26 between Rhododendron and the junction with Highway 35. The work will take 3 years, from 2014 to 2017. Some of the rock cliffs above the highway will be blasted away to reduce rock fall hazards. Also, it is proposed to install a center barrier on 2.3 of those miles. The passing lanes will be extended by 1,400 feet to give motorists more space and more time to complete passing maneuvers. ODOT has come out with a Fact Sheet and Frequently Asked Questions Sheet about the scheduled improvements on Highway 26 between Milepost 49.2 and MP 57.45 which should be of great interest to anyone traveling across Mt. Hood. We have attached both documents on the newsletter page.

The Far West Ski Week 2014 will be in Beaver Creek, Colorado. The dates will be January 25 to February 1, 2014. We now have our lodging assignments, and the flier is attached. The price is \$1,229 pp including 7 nights'

lodging, a 5 out of 7 day lift pass, and the FWSA amenities package. See flier. Note this special deal: Lift tickets are included in the ski week package; however, EPIC passes will also be available and should be purchased from the Tour Operator at Skigroup.net by calling 1-800-500-2SKI (2754). Each member purchasing the EPIC pass through Skigroup will receive a \$25 discount off their lodging during ski week. Forest Service in charge of Old Mt. Hood Hwy.

The first road built for cars to and around Mt. Hood was built in the early 1920s and completed by **1924**. In **1937**, President F. D. Roosevelt used this old road when he came to inaugurate Timberline Lodge.

This old road has both **historic** and **recreational** value, even though it has been neglected for the past 60 years. A portion of the old highway just west of Government Camp has been torn up by the Forest Service in the summer of **2012**. Only about 100 yards has been torn up.



UPDATE: Emilio Trampuz (of Mountain High) has recently met with two Forest Service representatives at the Zig Zag Ranger District. They both seemed very friendly and helpful and showed a willingness to improve the area for recreation.

If you write to them, don't focus on criticism of the upturned roadway, though you can mention it. But focus on **positive alternatives**. They want to hear from you.

What would you like to see happen? What form of recreation are you seeking (hiking, biking, jogging, horseriding)? Would you like to see the upturned asphalt cleared away? Would you like to see an interpretive trail with signs, especially since the old Barlow Road follows the exact same route as the old paved highway west of Government Camp?

Newly announced is the **Mountain Collective Pass**. It's a similar cooperation between several ski areas: Whistler/Blackcomb, Aspen/Snowmass, Jackson Hole, Alta/Snowbird, Mammoth Mt., and Alpine Meadows/Squaw Valley. This is not a season pass. It's a 12-time pass, with a maximum of just 2 days at each destination (6 areas total). It has no blackout dates, and it costs \$379. Additional days at the resorts are 50% off, and there are lodging discounts up to 25% off. For further information, go to www.mountaincollective.com. YELLOWSTONE CLUB -- BIG SKY OWNERS PURCHASE UPSCALE DEVELOPMENT

CrossHarbor Capital, owner of the Yellowstone Club, and Boyne Resorts, owner of Big Sky Resort, have purchased The Club at Spanish Peaks, a 5,700-acre upscale residential development near Big Sky, for \$26.1 million. The Club at Spanish Peaks had filed for Chapter 7 bankruptcy in 2011. The Club at Spanish Peaks operated three private chairlifts for its members, who could use the lifts to access Big Sky's Southern Comfort lift to ski Andesite Mountain or get to Lone Peak. The resort of Spanish Peaks also operates its own private ski hill named Spirit Mountain which has a high-speed quad serving 13 runs on 207 acres.
