FWSA AWARDS PROGRAMS AT FWSA CONVENTION: With NWSCC hosting this year's FWSA Convention, we would like to see MANY of our clubs entering the awards competitions and sending their members to Convention. There are no opportunities quite like this for your club to gain recognition for its accomplishments!

The easiest entries for your club are for Outstanding Newsletter and Outstanding Website, and while it is a bit more effort to prepare an Outstanding Club Application, your club will be judged against other clubs of the same size throughout FWSA, and it is really fun to WIN! With the entries you need to submit the name of someone from your club who will act as a judge in the category you are entering; it's easy because the judge will only need to look at 2 club's newsletters or websites.

Your club can also enter the "Club & Council Historical Recognition" Program with a history of your club - potential museum or library reference resources!

Is your club active in community service or charitable activities? Then enter the "Charities and Our Community Service Recognition" program for the chance to be one of 3 clubs to receive checks to be donated to the charity of your choice!

Individual awards that are well worth entering are for the following awards:

Safety Person of the Year Award: Any ski club or council can nominate any club member. The prize is an all expense paid trip for TWO to Aspen/Snowmass, including

airfare, luxury lodging, skiing, demos, and is a fantastic trip! Isn't there someone in your club who has done special things to promote safety? Take the steps to enter them - Oregon has had TWO winners of this prize so far!!

Western Ski Heritage Award: The prize for this award is a 5-night ski package for two at Steamboat with lodging, lift tickets, rentals, tours, lessons, and a lunch (no airfare), and an engraved crystal trophy. The award recognizes the best effort in the prior year that finds, preserves, documents and shares the history of snowsports in the West. The award is open to an individual, a group, or a team and can be self-nominated or nominated by a club or club member. This award is not restricted to FWSA club members.

The NWSCC Board will review all Man and Woman of the year nominations and will choose one man and one woman to be NWSCC's 2014 winners. In making its choice NWSCC will consider FWSA's criteria, which includes service not only to a person's club, but also to their Council, their Community, and FWSA. The Man and Woman selected will go on to the FWSA level to compete against the other councils in FWSA. The Council Man and Woman must attend the FWSA 2014 Convention in order to compete at the FWSA level. NWSCC will pay their Convention registration fees. This is a great way to meet other Council/Club members and contribute to FWSA programs. RECAP OF DECEMBER 18 MEETING:

Our guest speaker was Karen Norton of Mt. Hood Skibowl, which in hindsight has been making the best of a very bad snow year. Skibowl was able to open for tubing, but until recently there has not been enough snow for skiing. Skibowl offers the extremely popular cosmic tubing at night, and has two ziplines open. Any time they were able they made snow, and offered beginner lessons at amazing rates on their rope tows. The snowmaking during the latest deep freeze, combined with natural snow, has finally enabled them to open all the lifts. The bars and restaurants have been open and there is a new bar and grill at East side (Multorpor). We wish Skibowl the best for the remainder of this unusual season!

The 2012-2013 Ski Challenge Winners were announced. First, with 14 areas skied, was Emilo Trampuz, who won a Mt. Hood Meadows lift ticket. There was a tie for second place with 10 areas skied, so Kurt Wilke and Bob Burns each received a gift certificate to Huckleberry Inn.

Membership report: We have two new ski club members from Seattle: Eastside Seattle Ski Meetup Club and Ski Duck.

Randy Lew talked about the FWSA Surge to Sochi, which is a fundraiser for the US Women's Ski Jumpers. FWSA was trying to raise \$5,000 by February 5th. The proceeds from the PIE Auction held that evening were donated to this cause.

Sandi Shaub led our annual PIE auction, and we raised \$360 to be donated to the women ski jumpers.

RECAP OF JANUARY 15 MEETING: (Thanks to Julie Rasmussen for the information from this meeting.) Our guest speaker was Dave Tragethon from Mt. Hood Meadows. Meadows has been open since the day after Thanksgiving and had plenty of snow for early season. Snow was moved from the parking lot, they were making and moving snow to all runs. Meadows has expanded their cross country trails, which will be open to the end of March. The cross country season pass is \$80, or \$10 per day to use the tracks. This year Meadows will stay open through the middle of May, as Wells Fargo and K2 will be sponsoring the first two weekends in May. Meadows has a Riglet Program for kids under 6 which has been very successful. It is \$79 for a midweek ticket with the bus. Cooper Spur was not yet open, but just opened at the time of this writing.

Women Ski Jumpers: Far West Ski Foundation was close to meeting their \$5,000 donation goal. Jessica Jerome was the first woman to make the US Ski Team.

Athletic Scholarship Program: Mary read a thank you letter from NWSCC's recipient, Alex Oseland.

2014 Far West Convention: Steve Coxen passed out information about the awards and qualifications available to clubs and the council and stressed that NWSCC should have several entries since our convention is local. These entries need to be in by March 20, or you can send him suggestions or names. If any Northwest resorts and retailers are interested in booth space at Convention, they should contact Mary Olhausen. Mary talked about the optional activities: golf, Smith Rock hike, and shop/dine/wine at the Mill District.

Steve announced that Far West board positions will be open. Anyone interested in running for a FWSA board position should contact him at PublicAffairs@nwskiers.org.

PACRAT NEWS:

Greg Dilger reported at the December NWSCC meeting that they have about 200 racers. The cost of Meadows tickets is being reduced and ticket prices should be about the same at all areas. They have new beer sponsors: Laginitas Brewing and Awesome Ales. The year end party will be in the dance pavillon at Oaks Park, with a theme "The Great Ratsby." The slow start to winter conditions on Mt. Hood led to the first NASTAR race and first PACRAT race scheduled at Mt. Hood Skibowl to be canceled. The January 26 race was held at Mt. Hood Meadows, and the February 9 race was canceled due to the ice storm, but all future races should run as scheduled. Charlie's Mountain View.

Windjammer Cruise! Dale and Sheri Parshall are running a "Schneyente" trip and have charted the sailing ship Sagitta through Island Windjammers to cruise around St. Maarten and the Leeward Islands (St. Barts, St. Kitts, St. Eustatius, Anguilla, Nevis). The charter is June 22-28. There are 12 double occupancy cabins (so 24 total passengers) and they need to fill 4 cabins. \$3,290 per cabin includes 6 nights (board Sunday, sail Mon-Fri, depart Sat). INTRAWEST IPO: Intrawest Resorts Holdings, Inc., which owns and/or manages Winter Park, Stratton, Steamboat, Mont Tremblant, Blue Mountain, and Snowshoe, announced an initial public offering of 15,625,000 shares of its common stock at \$12 per share under the symbol "SNOW". They also priced 3,125,000 shares of its common stock and an entity controlled by certain private equity funds managed by an affiliate of Fortress Investment Group LLC priced an additional 12,500,000 shares of the Company's common stock. According to a company press release, the net proceeds received from the offering was expected to be approximately \$35.1 million which they intend to use for working capital and other general corporate purposes.

WOLF MOUNTAIN PURCHASED OUT OF BANKRUPTCY:

Wolf Mountain ski area in Utah's Ogden Valley has been purchased by an investor group called Skyline Mountain Base from America First Credit Union, which acquired the resort through bankruptcy. Next ski season, it will reopen as Skylline Mountain Base.

ASPEN TO RETAIN THE X GAMES THROUGH 2019:

ESPN and Aspen Skiing Company have reached an agreement that will keep the X Games in Aspen/Snowmass, Colorado, through 2019. Now in its 13th year hosting the premiere winter action sports event, by the end of the extension Aspen will have been home to the event for nearly two decades. ESPN's X Games Aspen 2014 celebrated its 13th year in Aspen in January with live coverage on ESPN and ABC. Snowboarder X and Snowmobile Long Jump returned to the X Games Aspen list of disciplines in 2014 after a brief hiatus.

BIG SKY GETS NEW ZIPLINE: Big Sky Resort is the has added a new Adventure Zipline -- a chairlift accessed tour made up of three zipline sections and the existing twin zipline, which spans up to 1,500 feet long and 150 feet above the forest floor. The entire zipline tour offers 5,000 feet of ziplining and expansive views of Lone Mountain and the Spanish Peaks of the Madison Mountain Range.
