FWSA CONVENTION REPORT FROM THE FWSA

NEWS: The Far West Ski Association conducted its 83rd Annual Convention and Meeting June 4-7, 2015, at the Town and Country Resort & Convention Center, hosted by the San Diego Council of Ski Clubs. The 30th Annual Silent Auction on Friday evening raised over \$35,000 to support FWSA programs. The highest bidders purchased ski trips, bicycle tours, diving trips, and other tour packages. Saturday morning's Travel Expo allowed industry representatives to meet with travel decision makers from the Association's clubs and councils to plan for future travel. Saturday afternoon was dedicated to a presentation by Stacey Cook, Olympian and member of the US Ski Team. Stacey took 2nd place in the historic, first-ever podium sweep in the Lake Louise downhill in 2015. (Lindsey Vonn was 1st and Julia Mancuso was 3rd.) The Key presenters in the Public Affairs

panel were Matthew Drake, CEO of Mt. Hood Meadows Ski Resort; Sean Styles, Meteorologist and Lifestyle Reporter for CS News 8 in San Diego; and Chuck Morse, recipient of the 2015 FWSA Snowsports Builders Award. Bids were presented to the FWSA Travel Committee for selection of the location of the 2017 FWSA Ski Week. Results will be announced later this summer. Annual recognition awards were presented to members of the ski industry, media, volunteers, racing leagues, councils and ski clubs. We wish Ann the best in her new position.] Chris Santella, currently a Portland resident and author of "Fifty Places to Ski and Snowboard Before You Die: Downhill Experts Share the World's Greatest Destinations," won the Bill Berry media award in the Featured News category.

Non-divers pay \$836 pp/do. You'll have time to explore and experience the local culture, or simply relax and enjoy the resort. Far West Ski Week 2016: Telluride Ski Resort is the location for the Far West Ski Week trip January 30-February 6, 2016. \$100 deposits are now being accepted for this trip (fully refundable until June 30)! NWSCC will have two very fine choices for lodging, both ski in/ski out: condos at Bear Creek Lodge, or hotel rooms at The Peaks Resort. The package price for the hotel will be \$1,430 pp/do; for 2 bedroom condos the price will be \$1,330 pp/do; and for either 3 or 4 bedroom condos the price will be \$1,200! These prices are for land only (no air or transfers), but include 7 nights' lodging, Welcome Party, Pub Crawl, Council Night Dinner, Mountain Picnic (not accessible to non-skiers, due to location), Après Ski Party, Races, a Banquet with dancing, and 6 of 7 day Lift Ticket (no senior discount). NSAA Recognizes Individual & Resort Achievments: The National Ski Areas Association presented 2015 Lifetime Achievement Awards to David Ingemie, president of Snowsports Industries America, and Bob Roberts, president and CEO of the 2015 California Ski Industry Association. Both have announced their planned retirements. Their annual Safety Awards were awarded to Sun Valley Resort,

Idaho; Angel Fire Resort, New Mexico, Aspen Snowmass, Colorado., Wachusett Mountain, Massachusettes., and Snowbowl, Arizona. Adam Wunderlich, mountain patrol manager at Boreal Mountain Resort, California, was named the 2015 Safety Champion. Congratulations to you all!

Ski Magazine Presents 2015 Golden Eagle Awards: SKI Magazine honored three ski areas with the 2015 Golden Eagle Awards for Environmental Excellence, including Winter Park Resort, Colorado, Mt. Hood Meadows, Oregon, and Shawnee Peak, Maine. Brent Giles, Powdr Corp., Utah, was named the 2015 "Hero of Sustainability."

U.S. Ski Team Takes NASTAR Reins: The US Ski Team and NASTAR have entered into an agreement where the team manages NASTAR with the idea of raising the profile of ski racing in America. The partnership is a vital part of the USSA's efforts to activate more young skiers into the sport across America. It expects its integration with NASTAR to help grow awareness and to serve as a recruiting tool for the USSA's 400-plus local clubs across the country. "We see great growth potential in NASTAR paired with the US Ski Team brand," said USSA CEO Michael Jaquet. "It's a natural fit for our team sponsors who want to reach a larger audience, including the thousands of families with kids engaged in ski racing."

Whistler Blackcomb Says "NO" to Smoking: Whistler-Blackcomb has rolled out a new smoke-free policy as of May 31, coinciding with World No Tobacco Day. The policy now prohibits smoking anywhere on Whistler-Blackcomb property, including lift lines, chairlifts, gondolas, ski runs, hiking trails, valley base areas, parking lots, the bike park trails on Whistler Mountain, and all Whistler-Blackcomb bar and restaurant locations including outdoor patios. [Way to go, Whistler!!]

Excerpts from the NATIONAL SKI CLUB NEWS:

Nationally, U. S. skier days were down. Skier visits nationally fell to 53.6 million in 2014-15, marking the second worst season in 16 years for visits, largely due to dismal snow conditions in the far West.

PURGATORY IS PURGATORY AGAIN. The southern Colorado ski area of Purgatory – which has spent the past decade or so named 'Durango Mountain Resort' has a new owner who has decided to change the ski area's title back to its original name – Purgatory. Local businessman James Coleman is the resort's new owner and he is investing in a new high speed quad chairlift to replace chair #8 for the coming ski season – the resort's 50th season.

IDAHO CLUB CHANGES ITS NAME. Idaho's Pocatello Ski Club is now The Pocatello Ski and Snowboard Association; with a new website and logo being launched

with the name change is sort of like a Grand Re-Opening for this long lasting club.

FOUNDER OF SNOWBIRD DIES AT 85. Dick Bass, partner and chairman of Snowbird Ski and Summer Resort, died Sunday, July 26, 2015, at the age of 85 in Dallas, Texas. Bass spent 44 years building Snowbird into a world-renowned, year-round destination mountain resort which he co-founded the resort in 1971 with Ted Johnson, and maintained sole ownership of the resort until selling the majority interest in Snowbird to Ian Cumming in May 2014. Bass received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Ski Areas Assn in 2006.

VAIL COMBINING CANYONS & PARK CITY MOUNTAIN RESORT UNDER THE NAME PARK CITY. Vail Resorts is combining Park City Mountain Resort with the Canyons, to be called simply; Park City Mountain Resort. Vail purchased Park City last year for \$182.5 million. The new logo features the red color used in the Park City Mountain logo and the infinity sign from the Canyons logo. Although the signs say only "Park City," the Canyons name will be sticking around only in signage on that side of the mountain that will say, "Park City Canyons Village." Vail Resorts is spending \$50 million on upgrades, including a gondola connecting the resorts, two lifts and new restaurants -- all of which are expected to be ready by the 2015-2016 ski season.

RMSP+ PASS HOLDERS NOW GET ACCESS TO ALASKA'S ALYESKA RESORT. The Rocky Mountain Super Pass+ (RMSP+) now includes Alyeska Resort in Alaska, located 40 miles from Anchorage, Alaska. This addition offers RMSP+ pass holders the opportunity to satisfy their sense of adventure with three days of skiing at the full-service resort. The RMSP+ now covers five Colorado resorts; Winter Park Resort, Steamboat, Copper Mountain, Eldora, and Crested Butte, plus Mt. Ruapehu in New Zealand. Alyeska Resort is the largest ski area in Alaska with over 1,600 skiable acres. The resort also has the Four-Star Hotel Alyeska, a 304-room luxury property with restaurant, shops, and spa services. As part of the new relationship, those who buy an Alyeska Resort season pass will get three total days that they can use at Copper Mountain, Steamboat, and Winter Park, giving Alyeska pass holders a chance to sample some of the best skiing Colorado has to offer. The RMSP+ is currently on sale for \$559 for adults. For more information on the RMSP+ pass or to purchase, please visit www.skicolorado.com.

SUN PEAKS ADDS MORE RUNS. British Columbia's Sun Peaks Resort will add two new trails and increased glading for next ski season. The two new runs in the West Morrisey area will continue to build out the challenging Laundromat area in anticipation of the planned West Morrisey chairlift.


